

## **INSCRIPTION FOR THE BRONZE PLAQUE:**

### **"In Tribute to Dennis (Denis) McGuire (1829-1888) Civil War Hero of Cicero, New York (1864-1865)**

**"Dennis McGuire, farmed, with one arm, on his 6 acre farm in the heart of Cicero for 23 years, after having his right arm shattered by a Confederate musket ball at Gravelly Run in the bitter cold rain-soaked Battle of Quaker Road March 29, 1865 southwest of Petersburg, Virginia. He suffered phantom pain for the next 23 years from nerves from his lower right arm which had been amputated at the elbow. Pain and suffering no doubt contributed to his early death at age 59.**

**Dennis and his wife Ellen's farmhouse on their farm on Lot 54 in the heart of Cicero, remains today on the south side of Route 31 just west of the creek west of downtown Cicero. They were members of the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Cicero. After his death at Christmas-time 1888, Ellen McGuire donated money for a window at Sacred Heart Catholic Church. Ellen died at Christmas time 1893, though her gravestone incorrectly reads 1883. Both Dennis and Ellen are buried at St. Agnes-St. Mary's Cemetary in Syracuse, in separate gravesites. Both graves are marked with a Union Soldier gravestone.**

**Dennis fought in the 185th New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment in which he enlisted as a Private in 1864, at age 36 married and a father. When he enlisted he was living in an apartment at 390 and 396 North Salina Street in Syracuse; directly across from the site of the modern day statue of Colonel Gustavus P. Sniper, who recruited, commanded, and led the Regiment. Dennis fought in Company I of the Regiment in Virginia in the Regiment's many battles through the Autumn of 1864 and Winter of 1865. They were a major force in General Grant's major offensive launched March 29, 1865 with the the Battle of Quaker Roads. The Union victory, including Dennis' part in it, was a crushing blow to the Confederacy leading to to the surrender at Appomattox Courthouse but 11 days later.**

**The battle was fought in the bitter cold, torrential rain falling, and the ground a virtual quagmire. Horses and wagons were nearly swallowed sinking in the mud. Dennis' right arm was shattered by a Confederate musket ball at Gravelly Run near Lewis Farm in the Battle of Quaker Roads at the junction of Boydton Plank and Quaker Roads. He was evacuated to the makeshift hospital at Fort Stedman east of Petersburg.**

**Army Chaplain Thomas Hodgman of Livingston County, New York visited and interviewed Dennis there April 1, 1865 and described in his Chaplain Diary Dennis' bravery and character. He mentions "visiting the wounded soldiers at Fort Stedman-opposite Petersburg March 31," writing that there were: " 500 in number and that he had been writing letters for their friends and relatives."**

**On April 1 his entry was:**

**"Again we visited the hospital, conversed with the soldiers and wrote letters to their friends. We find very sincere and intelligent men among them, and as much devoted to Christ as to their country and willing to sacrifice all. Especially one intelligent Irishman 185th N.Y. from Cicero, Onon. County- named Dennis McGuire. He lost his right arm at the elbow and suffered terribly but not a word of complaint from his lips. Said he knew his wife would love him all the better for the loss of his right arm for his country."**

Abraham and Mary Todd Lincoln and their son Tad were in the area from March 24 to March 30, based aboard the River Queen docked at City Point, Virginia; visiting Petersburg, and March 25 and 26 visiting Fort Stedman and the nearby fields strewn with masses of dead soldiers. Lincoln witnessed the fierce battle March 25 in which Union forces retook Fort Stedman, briefly held that morning by the Confederates.

Lincoln saw first hand the suffering at the scene of Dennis' hospitalization. Looking worn and haggard, Lincoln remarked to a Lieutenant that he "had seen enough of the horrors of war" that he "hoped this was the beginning of the end" and that "there would be no more bloodshed or ruin of homes." Dennis was later evacuated to Harewood Army Hospital in Washington, D.C.; where he remained until mustered out of the Army May 30.

22 years earlier in 1843, at age 14, Dennis had survived the arduous voyage across the Atlantic, from Ireland to the U.S., on his journey from his birthplace in County Cavan Ireland to Syracuse and ultimately Cicero. After his arrival he worked as a laborer on constructing canals, and on other projects. He Declared Intent to be Naturalized as a U.S. Citizen in 1856, and was naturalized in 1859.

In 1862 he married Ellen Boyle (1833-1893), a survivor of a separate voyage from Ireland, in a Catholic Church in Syracuse. Their first two children died in infancy: James (1863-64) and Margaret (1864-65).

Their next four children all survived and excelled in life: Their sons John J. "Jerry" McGuire (1866-1951) and Frank H. McGuire (1868-1940), were both Attorneys in Ithaca, New York and educated at Cornell University Law School. John J. was an outstanding Attorney in Ithaca for over 50 years. Frank H. was an excellent student at Oswego State Normal School and then transferred to State Normal School Mansfield Pennsylvania, where he graduated in 1894. A letter of recommendation from Mansfield called him "perhaps the strongest man in the class." Next he was a student at Cornell University Law School, and then served as Law Clerk in John J.'s office before moving west in 1898. There he was an outstanding Attorney for 42 years in Guthrie, Oklahoma; Oklahoma's Territorial and original State Capital. Frank H.'s son Lloyd H. McGuire Sr. (1904-1964) was an outstanding Attorney in Guthrie and Tulsa for 31 years and a Judge in Tulsa for 8 years. His son Lloyd H. McGuire Jr. (1932) of Guthrie and Tulsa was an outstanding History and Political Science Teacher for 33 years in Kansas and in San Diego, California.

Dennis and Ellen's daughters Mary A. McGuire and Helen McGuire, were both well educated, and highly regarded School Teachers. Helen was the Organist at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Cicero, 1888-89. Mary's grandson, John Litzenberger, remained living near Cicero and in 1990-1992 joined with Lloyd H. McGuire Jr. researching their great grandfather Dennis McGuire extensively.

After discharge from the Army Dennis bought, and began farming with one arm, the 6 Acre farm in the heart of Cicero. The U.S. Census listed him as a Tin Peddler in 1870; as a Gardener in 1875; and as a Farmer by 1880, as did the Cicero City Directory in 1878, and his Death Certificate in 1888. He suffered from the phantom pain from his missing right arm most of the time.

Dennis McGuire was long remembered by all who knew him, as he has been by each later generation of his family. He was truly a hero, who gave his all to his country, and earned tribute in 1865 and in the 23 years that followed. This is in tribute to him." Page 2 of 2

**SUBJECT:** Maintenance of traffic light(s) and controller(s) at: Gillette Rd. Middle School, Brewerton Grade School, and on Orangeport Rd.

Dear Madame/Sir;

Syracuse Signal Systems, Inc. agrees to furnish and deliver to the above, the services for which the bid is made and at the price as follows:

**Controller service rate** - \$ 100.00 per month, billed quarterly. This rate includes all routine repairs without additional payment. Routine repairs typically include bulb changes, load relay replacements and all other minor repairs. Additional payment to Syracuse Signal Systems above this basic service rate shall be made for all major repairs, equipment upgrades, modifications, or enhancements as stipulated in the general provisions of this contract.

The general provisions of the contract shall be as follows:

**1. INTENT OF CONTRACT.** It is the intent of this contract that Syracuse Signal Systems shall provide at a quoted, hourly price, all labor, material, tools, equipment and insurance necessary for the maintenance of traffic light(s) and control(s) so as to provide reliable and continuous operation.

**2. CONTRACT PERIOD.** The terms of the purchase order issued to Syracuse Signal Systems based on these specifications shall be from January 01, 2013 to December 31, 2013 inclusive.

**3. CONTRACT TERMINATION.** It shall be the prerogative of The Town of Cicero (owner) to terminate any purchase order so issued, if performance is not entirely satisfactory. This termination shall be without penalty to the owner. It shall also be the prerogative of Syracuse Signal Systems to terminate the contract without penalty to Syracuse Signal Systems (30) days after the owner receives written receipt of such intent.

**4. RECOMMENDATION OF EQUIPMENT UPGRADE.** Should the owner's equipment be deemed unserviceable due to age, wear, or damage, Syracuse Signal Systems will

recommend that the equipment be upgraded and will state the reasons why. The owner has the option of denying the recommendation, seeking competitive bids, or negotiating a price for upgrade with Syracuse Signal Systems. Syracuse Signal Systems shall reserve the right to terminate the contract if the recommendation is denied and the equipment is deemed no longer adequately serviceable.

**5. AVAILABILITY FOR SERVICE.** Syracuse Signal Systems shall be available (365) days per year, (24) hours per day, for the emergency repair of the subject equipment to insure safe and continuous operation. The telephone numbers listed at the end of this contract may be used for service requests and all authorized calls for emergency service shall be responded to quickly.

**6. MODIFICATION OF OPERATION OF CONTROLLER (when required).** Syracuse Signal Systems will check with the proper State, County, and local officials for necessary approvals. The modification will then be performed and if any new equipment is required, material charges will apply.

**7. DAMAGE TO SIGNALS, CONTROLLER, OR BOTH.** Syracuse Signal Systems will perform necessary steps to provide for safety of traffic using the intersection. It is understood, however, that Syracuse Signal Systems will not perform major repairs resulting from damage without additional payment under provisions of the basic contract (paragraph 11).

**8. INSURANCE.** Contractor's liability insurance certificate is provided per request.

**9. INVOICING.** At the end of each quarter, basic maintenance invoices will be presented to the owner. All other invoices (modifications or major repair) will present when the work is completed.

**10. ROUTINE SERVICE CALLS -** Routine service calls for repair shall be made as necessary without additional cost to the owner and shall include basic response, labor, repair, and replacement of components, but shall be limited to three (3) hours labor and/or \$100.00 in material costs. Any repair requiring more than 3 hours of labor and/or \$100.00 in material costs shall be considered a major repair as stipulated in paragraph 11.

**11. MAJOR REPAIR.** Syracuse Signal Systems, Inc. makes no guarantees of the owner's equipment, and shall not be responsible for major repairs of said equipment without additional payment by the owner to Syracuse Signal Systems, Inc. A major repair shall be construed as any repair requiring more than 3 hours of labor and/or \$100.00 in material costs. When any major repair is required, the owner shall be notified as to the extent and cost of the repair. The owner has the option of seeking competitive bids or negotiating a price for repair with Syracuse Signal Systems. Major repairs can be resultant from; but not limited to damage from natural or environmental causes, accidents, construction work (e.g. road milling operations), vandalism, theft, age related wear, obsolescence, or from malfunction of major components, regardless of age.

**12. PAYMENT FOR MODIFICATIONS, ENHANCEMENTS OR EQUIPMENT UPGRADES.** The intent of the contract is to reasonably maintain the equipment in its current state. Syracuse Signal Systems, Inc. shall not be responsible for equipment replacement, modifications, or upgrades even if the owner is required to do so by the roadway governing authority (Village, City, County, or State) without additional payment from the owner.

ALTERNATE NUISANCE WILDLIFE  
AGREEMENT  
(2013-2014)

This agreement by and between Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter), 101 Lewis Road, Bernhards Bay, NY 13028 for the Town of Cicero, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, 8236 Brewerton Road, Cicero, NY, 13039, (Town)

WITNESS

For and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties hereby mutually agree as follows:

1. The Town designates Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) as the party responsible for nuisance wildlife control in the Town, and authorizes Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) to trap and remove nuisance animals from the town limits of the Town in accordance with the terms and conditions of this agreement.
2. The term of this agreement shall be the 26<sup>th</sup> day of November 2013 until the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December 2014. Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) shall provide new license number as of October 1, 2014 (Gary Suter's - License #1198, expires September 30, 2014) to the Town simultaneously upon execution of this agreement.
3. Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) will promptly respond to all notifications of problems from the officers and employees and agents of the Town, and Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) will exercise his expertise in the collection and removal of all nuisance animals, as directed by said officers, employees and agents of the Town.
4. The Town agrees to pay Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each nuisance animal removed by Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter). The Town agrees to pay Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) Fifty and No/100 Dollars (\$50.00) for each beaver and each beaver dam that is destroyed and removed by Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter), so long as such removal is as per New York State permit. The

designated Town Roads. Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) shall provide an invoice for any services rendered to the Town, to the attention of the Town Clerk, within thirty (30) days of providing the service. All fees paid to Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) pursuant to this agreement shall not exceed a total of \$1,000.00 without further authorization of the Town.

5. The Town agrees to provide Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) with contact information for all persons calling the Town and relating problems regarding nuisance wildlife, to which Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) shall respond, such that Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) may advise the party calling the Town of a Twenty-Five and No/100 Dollar (\$25.00) service charge for the first time that Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) must go on or about the premises of the person calling. Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) shall explain that this charge is a one-time fee per property per contract year and is meant to compensate Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) for the necessary tracking, analysis, and other expert services performed in identifying the particular aspects of the problems on the premises of the party call the Town. It is understood that in no event shall the Town be responsible for this service charge and that it shall be the sole responsibility of Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) to recover such service charge from the party calling the Town.

6. Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) hereby agrees that he will indemnify and hold the TOWN harmless on account of any liability that the town may incur as a result of Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) actions.

7. Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter) hereby warrants that he is licensed by the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York and is skilled in the trapping and removal of nuisance animals and other pests.

8. The Town may terminate this agreement at any time upon providing thirty (30) days' written notice to Northeast Beaver & Predator Management (Gary Suter), via certified mail, return receipt requested, at the address above specified.



LOCAL LAW 13 OF 2013

*LOCAL LAW FILING – Town of Cicero*

**Local Law No. 13 of the year 2013.**

A local law Amending the Parks and Recreation Section 152-4c of the Town of Cicero Code to expand the terms and definitions of the ban against firearms in Cicero Parks to include a ban on air guns, bb guns, paintball guns or other dangerous instrument capable of causing physical harm to citizens and to eliminate the exception related to hunting. No person except Police Officers shall carry firearms (as defined in the NYS Penal Law).

**Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Cicero as follows:**

1. **Local Law #13 of 2013 – Amend the Parks and Recreation Section-152-4c – Firearms/Dangerous Instruments** ban against firearms in Cicero Parks to include a ban on air guns, bb guns, paintball guns or other dangerous instrument capable of causing physical harm to citizens and to eliminate the exception related to hunting. No person except Police Officers shall carry firearms (as defined in the NYS Penal Law).

**II. Effective Date**

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with Secretary of State.
