**PROPOSAL BY CHRIS MASTRIANNI, SALES AUDITOR FROM NATIONAL GRID  
REGARDING LIGHTING AUDIT FOR HIGHWAY, POLICE DEPARTMENT, POLE BARN  
AND OUTSIDE AREAS.**

Chris Mastrianni stated that he recently toured the facilities with Tracy last week and put together a lighting proposal for anything that he noted that was not energy efficient. National Grid will pay a percentage to upgrade to energy efficient lighting. In the Police Department and Highway garage, they run their lights almost all day long, and National Grid would retrofit the fixtures with sensors on them. Also, everything on the outside of the buildings can be changed to LED's, which National Grid would also pay a percentage towards that. Chris also mentioned that all of the older T-12 light lamps would be changed out to T-8 lamps for another energy savings. National Grid would pay close to 70% of the cost to change out all problem areas mentioned in this report.

Supervisor Corl stated that he would go over this proposal with the department heads and get back to him regarding their decision.

Tracy Cosilmon, Cicero Town Clerk stated that she had a copy of Chris Mastrianni's proposal available in her office.

**INFORMATIONAL HEARING PURSUANT TO TOWN CODE SECTION 74-6 REGARDING  
ABATEMENT SAFETY CONCERNS AT 5451 BENNETT STREET, BREWERTON  
AND PRESENTATION OF REPORT FILED BY TOWN OF CICERO CODES  
ENFORCEMENT OFFICER**

John Marzocchi stated the statute allows for this Board to make a determination based upon the Code Enforcement Officer's report on the property as to whether the property is a blight on the neighborhood, is a safety problem, or is a fire hazard. The Board had the report drawn up by Steve Procopio from the Code Enforcement office, based on his personal inspection of the property. He has concluded, based upon the guidelines of the statute, that this property should be remediated by removal of the structure. This report as well as a letter outlining the rights under the statute has been personally served to the property owner, posted on the property as well, and a certified copy was mailed to the property owner.

There has been no action to date. He had been contacted recently by an attorney for the property owner and in order to proceed, the first step is to have an informational hearing, presented to the board. A vote on the resolution by the board as to whether this board orders a remediation, then

the town would have a contractor demolish the structure and the cost would be added to the tax bill on the property.

Supervisor Corl solicited any comments from the Board.

Councilor Conway stated that the fire department could be involved in this demolition as part of their training for life safety.

John Marzocchi stated for the record, the notice that was served on the property owner advised them of tonight's Town Board meeting and gave them the opportunity to appear as well.

Supervisor Corl asked if anyone in the audience was present on behalf of the property owner.

No one came forward at this request.

Supervisor Corl moved the adoption of a resolution that this Board makes findings that the proof submitted by the Codes Enforcement Officer substantiates the findings that the structure located at 5451 Bennett Street is in fact a dangerous building pursuant to 74-6 of the Town of Cicero Code.

John Marzocchi stated that a Paper road is referring to a sub-division that a developer files a Tract Map for. In there are roads designated and if those roads are deeded over to the town, the Town will become responsible for the maintenance and will own those roads. Sometimes, the roads are not dedicated or deeded to the Town; therefore they remain the property of the developer. The Town has a right to develop those roads in the future if they are ever deeded to us. If the roads are not deeded to us, we can abandon this potential future right to have title ownership of this road. This road was never deeded to the Town.

Supervisor Corl opened the public hearing to consider a formal abandonment of a portion of an undeveloped Paper road described as the unpaved portion of Ontario Avenue from the south line of Lot 31 of the Island View Track, southerly to the intersection of South Bay Road. The proposed abandonment would release the Town’s option to build a roadway over the portion of the reservation to the adjoining landowners, to the center line of the former proposed road. Also, the proposed crossed avenue also shown on said map 84 of Island View Park filed 8/31/23 as Map no. 1862.

Supervisor Corl stated that per the recommendation of Robert Germain, Town Attorney, this will be deferred to the July 24, 2013 meeting.

**AUTHORIZE SUPERVISOR TO SIGN THE INTER-MUNICIPAL WASTEWATER  
AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF CICERO AND  
COUNTY OF ONONDAGA**

Supervisor Corl stated that this was put on the agenda for further discussion after a presentation by Mr. Rhodes.

Bruce Letts, Town Engineer with C&S Engineers had the following comments to update the board on:

**Section 2 Definitions**

Offset plan. Refers to organic capacity, which we believe is an error. Reducing infiltration and inflow will help maintain hydraulic capacity but has nothing to do with organic capacity. The agreement should be modified to correct this statement.

**Section 3 Term**

The Town will need to decide on the number of five year terms this agreement will be in effect.

**Section 4 C Underground Facility Location**

The Town may not want to contract for this service and we understand that it can be crossed out before the contract is signed.

**Section 6 A Inflow and Infiltration Reduction.**

This statement is open ended and will likely obligate the Town to significant capital improvements to deal with the Infiltration and Inflow problem that is being experienced. It will be important for the Town to gain assurances that the County will help with this effort with at least technical expertise relative to problem locations, best technologies, and flow monitoring to gauge progress. We believe that the Town could sign this agreement with this understanding as a part of the resolution.

#### Sections 7 & 8

These sections include a number of paragraphs about Hold Harmless clauses and insurance provisions that should be reviewed by the Town Attorney.

#### Section 10 Conflict of interest

This section should also be reviewed by the Town Attorney. I don't understand how the Town is able to covenant and agree to this provision.

Supervisor Corl stated that this agenda item would be deferred to the next Town Board Meeting on July 24, 2013 so that these comments by Mr. Letts could be looked at by Mr. Rhodes for any feedback so we can move forward on this. At the last Town Board Meeting, the Board was in agreement with the long-term plan on this issue. Supervisor Corl just wanted to make sure that all of the newer concerns were properly addressed.

Supervisor Corl stated that this would be on the agenda for the July 24, 2013 meeting.

FREE FISHING WEEKEND AND RABIES CLINIC RESULTS

Town Clerk, Tracy Cosilmon stated that there will be a Free Fishing Weekend starting June 29 and 30<sup>th</sup>. She has provided information on the back table for all who are interested.

Tracy also stated that we recently had a very successful Rabies Clinic at our Highway garage provided by the Onondaga County Health Department. This particular clinic has always had a very good turnout for resident participation.

PUBLIC INPUT

A resident told the Town Board she had a question regarding a zoning issue and hoped that Steve Procopio, from the Zoning department could answer this if the Town Board could not. She asked if she installed a new fireplace and did not get a permit and got caught, what the penalty would be.

Steve Procopio stated that his office tries to work with the resident to obtain a permit for what they installed to be in compliance.

The resident understood that there was no real incentive to get a permit and that she realized that the Town could make her rip out the fireplace. She wondered why there was not a permit required and also a fine.

Steve Procopio explained that if a resident comes in after the fact to get a permit, the fee for that permit now would be doubled.

A resident stated that recently there was a press conference announcing a huge savings in our budget, about \$1.2 million dollars.

Supervisor Corl stated that the correct amount was \$1.6 million dollars.

The resident wondered how we could be off 16% on such a large budget.

Supervisor Corl explained that if he looked at the Annual End of the Year Report, going line by line, this would show where the savings were and said he would get this resident a copy of this report. He also stated that the 2012 Budget, which was voted on by this Board and former Supervisor, which was a 5-0 vote, called for a \$10,266,936.00 budget. Last year we spent approximately \$8,666,582.32. This amount went back into the General Fund balance.

The resident wondered if any refund checks would be issued to the taxpayers for the 2012 savings.

Supervisor Corl stated that he would have to check with the Comptroller, but did not think so.

The resident was looking at the paving schedule and wanted to know if Lan-Co did the paving. He has noticed that there are no shoulders for pedestrians or bicyclists who would use that road.

It was stated that per the recommendation of the NYS DOT the striping will remain the same as in years past.
