Discussion:

Steve Procopio explained that Colonial Laundromat was conditionally approved by the Planning Board on October 7, 2009. The property where it is to be located is east of and adjacent to Sheldon Park and the Police Trailer in Bridgeport. The plan which was approved eliminates the entrance from the park onto Route 31 and creates reconfigured parking spaces for the park. Park personnel will be required to access the park through the Colonial property.

Heather Cole – The concept was approved by the Planning Board during the site plan approval for the Colonial Laundromat and I believe the parks office has reviewed it and is comfortable with it. Our office is in the process of drafting the easement agreement that will allow for ingress and egress across Colonial Laundromats property to the park property as well as designated parking spots for the park property on Colonial Laundromats property. If you would like to move forward contingent on a legal review and authorize the Supervisor to execute it on behalf of the town.

Heather Cole – Tracy, Motion was made by Mr. Dudzinski, seconded by Mr. Rybak, to conclude the Executive Session and return to open session. There are no items of outstanding business.

PUBLIC INPUT 3 MINUTES PER SPEAKER

Resident asked for the name of the program that approved earlier for the Zoning Department.

Steve Procopio - IQS

Resident – Does it have a name?

Steve Procopio - Not that I'm aware of.

Tracy Cosilmon – It's a program through Microsoft Word which allows the Zoning Office to pull up building permits and maps, rather than having them get the hard copy and is something that we've had for many years.

Resident – Will these documents, permits and maps be available to the public through e-mail or any other digital media, such as CD's or flash drive?

Tracy Cosilmon – Anyone can file a FOIL for information.

Resident stated that she knew it could be FOILED, but, will it be available by e-mail once it is FOILED, or by some digital medium.

Steve Procopio stated that he didn't know if it can be put in PDF form and that typically they print something if it's needed.

Donald Snyder, Mud Mill Road stated that he has received a number of mailings at his house and that he is a registered Republican who voted for Mr. Dudzinski. He was concerned about the action that Mr. Dudzinski took in 2009. We voted for Cicero to become a Suburban Town which placed the Supervisor in the position of Town Administrator and the person to complete and present the budget for discussion and approval. The tax information in 2009 was and is 3.25 percent. You voted no, for the budget that you proposed for approval. Because of how the board sits on the dais, you were the last to vote and because of the yes votes, given for the budget, you could vote no to your own budget and still have it approved. Why did you present a budget that you could not vote for?

Mr. Dudzinski – One thing you want to remember is that it isn't my personal budget. It's a budget that I have the ability to put together with our Budget Officer rather than sit down with everybody on the board. That is what makes the difference between a Suburban Town and a Town of the First Class. Its not, my budget, it's a budget that we put together, but, we all work on. We eventually get back together to discuss numbers and go from there.

Don Snyder – So, you're saying you didn't vote no, so, you could say in your campaign information this year that you've never voted for a tax increase.

Mr. Dudzinski – No

Don Snyder – You said that you have 16 years of experience and in those 16 years, you have never voted for a tax increase?

Mr. Dudzinski – When I made that comment it was when I was Supervisor. I know for a fact that we've voted for a tax increase in the 10 years prior to my becoming Supervisor. I'm running for Supervisor now and that is what it pertains to.

Tom Beaulieu, 6121 Palm Summit asked the Supervisor if the current budget that is being proposed was drawn up by the Budget Director.

Mr. Dudzinski – We're in the process of doing that right now.

Tom Beaulieu – I hope to come to one of the workshops. Since you weren't able to support the budget that you had drawn up last year, will you make a pledge tonight to actually vote for the budget, that you're proposing this year?

Mr. Dudzinski – We do not have solid figures at this time, so, for me to make any type of statement to that effect, would not be the correct thing to do.

Tom Beaulieu – You are the Chief Fiscal Officer of the town under Suburban Town. You've hired somebody to put a budget together, which is the process. Once that is done and this board has an opportunity to sit down as a group and review it, whatever the numbers come out and if there is a tax increase involved, it will be your budget primarily. Will you support your budget this year?

Mr. Dudzinski - If there is a tax increase that's warranted I probably would, but, we still have to look at different information that we do not have yet. We're still working with our numbers.

Tom Beaulieu – I understand

Mr. Dudzinski – I can't tell you if there will or won't be a tax increase. We just talked with one of the Fire Departments today.

Tom Beaulieu - Last year I grilled the Supervisor after the decision was made and felt it was incumbent on him to go back with his colleagues who had worked on this and put themselves in the position to approve a tax increase, yet you and Councilor Corl, took a buy on it. I think the consensus should be that if this is a group decision, everyone should make the same decision and that wasn't done last year.

Mr. Dudzinski – There are different situations and we don't all agree all of the time.

Tom Beaulieu stated that it left people wondering what happened here, last year. I think there was a consensus that this was going to be approved and two people decided not to support it and they didn't share that information with their colleagues and left them in the dark on it. I also took some numbers from last year's budget when we decided to spend an additional \$130,000.00 over the second place bidder to have the town reassessed. Going back and looking at the journal portion for 2009, that \$130,000.00 could have paid the salaries in the Town Clerk's Office \$73,000.00 as well as our Contractual Engineering fees of \$70,000.00. It could have also paid for NAVAC services which are \$26,000.00 as well as all of the Town's Economic Development, which is \$100,000.00. It could have also funded the entire \$100,000.00 for the Town's Senior Program and the salaries of the Lifeguards and \$30,000.00 in the Learn to Swim Program. It could have also funded all of your NYS Retirement in the amount of \$100,000.00 as well as 90% of this years Workman's Compensation, which is around \$40,000.00. Finally, it could have covered the entire fuel cost for snow removal for the Highway Department which was \$75,000.00 as well as the summer highway operations of \$60,000.00. That's a lot of funds and that budget could have actually used that money, instead of spending it on the additional cost of GAR Associates.

Mr. Dudzinski - I don't know if you were at those interviews or not.

Tom Beaulieu – No

Mr. Dudzinski explained that there were 3 different bidders. There was a low bidder, a middle bidder and GAR. One of the reasons why I didn't pick the second bidder is that I was uncomfortable with a response that he made to me when I was on the Interview Committee, which others can back up. That comment is part of the reason I didn't want to deal with them. If he was going to say that, what would he say to you, or somebody else?

Tom Beaulieu stated that once you sign a contract with somebody and they don't abide by the agreement, you can let them out of it.

Mr. Dudzinski – Yes, but, the damage would be done by then.

Tom Beaulieu - GAR Associates is involved in a multimillion dollar lawsuit over a job they did and if you didn't know that, you needed to know that before you hired them.

Mr. Dudzinski – They are Professional Appraisers and I have yet to get any bad feedback. We have checked with a lot of people and they have said they've been treated very well and courteously.

Mr. Corl – Not only was one of the associates that were interviewed unprofessional but, another had outstanding litigation in the Town of Vestal and there was a multitude of issues with that organization. When you are looking at the bidders you have to take into consideration, their professionalism, their track record and not just who is the lowest bidder. You have to consider what the most important asset is in most people's lives.

Tom Beaulieu – It's the community relations your going to have when you hire someone.

Mr. Corl – It's their house. When you're dealing with peoples home's which is probably the most important thing in their life monetarily, we have to make sure we are going to prepare and present to them, somebody who is going to be professional and who is able to communicate with them and do the best job with this project that we're working on throughout the town. It cost \$10.00 per parcel which is a little more, but that is what we had to do to out weigh.

Jim Delladonna, 8798 Emmons Mercantile stated that he had come before the board three years ago and was back representing himself and five other neighbors. He bought his home in March 2004 and shortly after that the Codes Enforcement Officer Joe Crispino, contacted him and told him that he shouldn't have gotten a CO because there was a water problem. I went back and forth with Jay Seitz and nothing seemed to happen and was told to be patient and things would work out. I came to the board and that is when I met Mr. Dudzinski. At that meeting Mr. Conway told me that anyone coming here should know that there's a water problem and a drainage problem. Moving from down state here, I didn't know that and I felt ridiculed at that meeting and by Jay Seitz who said that the building code regulations here are unenforceable. Mr. Dudzinski came out to the property with Mr. Seitz and saw the problem. Mr. Dudzinski sent O'Brien & Gere to my home and they looked at the properties and said there was a problem and recommended that it be corrected and said they would go back and talk to the town. I have procured the services of Germaine & Germaine and I was told that they would ask the town to pay for the services as they are in violation of not enforcing their code, but, our legal fees will cost you more than the repair. So, I spent \$1,200.00 to repair the duck pond and get that out of my property. The swale is still a problem. I met with Wayne from the building department two months ago and he told me he understood and would send someone out. No one has ever come out. Gary did come out and took a look but, nothing is done. I think I've been patient enough for the last 3 years. Now my neighbors are telling me, that we're paying taxes and it is a service that needs to be provided by the town for a swale. It is not a pretty situation there and you have 6 families that are getting ticked off. What do me and my neighbors have to do to get some sort of action?

Mr. Dudzinski asked Mr. Conway to go out there tomorrow.

Mr. Delladonna stated that he wanted to be there, so asked for the time they would be coming.

Mr. Conway stated that he would and will try to get a hold of Gary in the morning.
