PUBLIC INPUT

Deborah Gardner addressed the issue of the additional fee she is paying for trash, per month, that has been brought up several times. She thanked several Town employees for helping her by giving her the figures she used for her analysis. The specifications per the request for bids prepared by the County calls for a total of 9,719 stops this equals 9,828 trash units, as an example: the bid specifications stated that there were 99 2-Family stops, this equals 198 trash units (which is 1 unit per family). In 2013, the Town had 10,558 trash units; that is the difference of 730 units. The bid submitted by Syracuse Haulers was for \$1,652,230.00 which was to be paid in installments of \$137,685.83. We are actually paying \$9,052.50 more per month, which is \$12.40 per unit for the additional 730 units. Her tax bill reflects the cost of \$14.72 per month, which is \$2.32 more than the \$12.40 Syracuse Haulers is charging for these additional units. She is sure that the difference is for rubbish removal. The contract was awarded, "per the terms and conditions of the bid specifications", and all three bidders had the exact same set of bid specifications. Because the accuracy of the total number of stops was the responsibility of the Town, and/or County the Contractor should not be penalized. She now understands the \$9,052.50 difference that the people have questioned. She thinks it is fair and she does not think that the Town is being cheated.

Supervisor Corl closed the Public Input portion of the meeting.

Amy Corl, Supervisor Corl's wife – Being your last meeting as Town Supervisor, we just wanted to say that we LOVE YOU so much! We're so proud of you! And we wish you the best of luck on your new adventure.

Supervisor Corl – Thank you Amy.

Councilor Zambrano – Well, Amy was a little bit afraid that we were going to go into executive session, which I think Jim was going to announce next. Correct?

Supervisor Corl – Correct.

Councilor Zambrano – We will be going into executive session to discuss a ...

Supervisor Corl – Collective-bargaining agreement?

Councilor Zambrano – And we will not be reconvening. So, before we go into executive session and not reconvene, I wanted to take this opportunity to say again that this is the last formal meeting of 2013; and therefore, Jim's last meeting as Supervisor for the Town of Cicero. So before we go into executive session, if anyone would like to come up and talk about everything that has happened in the last two years under his supervision, the Board would really like to hear your comments and I think Jim would like to hear from any and all of you about his tenure, which I believe has been excellent. Deborah, I saw your hand come up so...

Supervisor Corl – Uh, oh.

Deborah Gardner – Corl, three years ago I never thought I would say something like this to you. I wish you God's speed. I think that you have done a very good job as Supervisor and I think that you have left a very good foundation that Supervisor-Elect Zambrano can work on. You probably could have used this two years ago; this is a little gift from my husband and me to you.

Councilor Zambrano – Will it explode?

(Laughter)

Supervisor Corl – Can I open it now?

Deborah Gardner – Yes.

Supervisor Corl – I never thought you would be giving me gifts (he opened it).

Deborah Gardner – It's a stress ball Jim.

Supervisor Corl – Ah! Very nice!

Councilor Zambrano – I think he's going to be less stressed at the County, myself.

(Laughter)

Councilor Zambrano – Would anyone else like to speak?

James Corl, III (Supervisor Corl's eldest son)– Okay, I would just like to say that for all the great things that you've done for the Town, and you still find time for us – your family. That's what I LOVE about you most. You're so busy! You work so hard! And through all this, you find time for us and your family. That's all I have to say. Thank you!

(Applause)

Supervisor Corl – Thank you James.

Doug Wickman, C & S Companies, Town Engineer – I should have gotten up faster, that's a hard act to follow. I'm sure you remember a couple of years ago Jim, the meetings started out a little bit rough. And I've watched as you have gained confidence and you've changed the tenor of these meetings. They are now well run. They promote timely communication. They are careful with careful and effective decision making. These changes, the meetings are indicative of the way you have conducted yourself as Supervisor; always willing to listen, and almost always, at least, in a calm and thoughtful manner. Under your leadership, things are better organized. There has been great progress. And you have moved this town in the right direction. I want to thank you for your leadership, your energy and your dedication. I don't know of any other supervisor that sends out an email at 11 o'clock at night and even more often, at 5 o'clock in the morning. I hope you maintain contact with this new board, your advice and council I am certain will be important. Thank you very much for your service, Jim.

Supervisor Corl – Thank you very much!

Suzanne DeMarzo – Thank you Jim for helping my mom on her campaign. Good luck! We will miss you!

Supervisor Corl – Thank you Suzanne.

Suzanne DeMarco- Your welcome!

Councilor Conway – I would like to thank Jim for all the hours he has put in on the Town Board, and working with all of us people that have been on the Town Board and I want to wish you the best of luck in your new job.

Supervisor Corl – Thank you Vern, I appreciate it.

Councilor Burtis – Well it has been a great opportunity for me and Jim and I ran together, along with Vern and we had a good team platform and it allowed me to be here. I appreciate that very much Jim and your service and your leadership to this board and for the things you have been able to lead us to accomplish. It's been a great two years of difficult service, but worthwhile. Jim and I haven't always agreed; they haven't been big disagreements, but when we have disagreed we've disagreed in private as I believe two gentlemen should and we've talked through our matters so I appreciate that too, that we've been able to do that and I've been able to make good decisions, I believe. I appreciate very much being under your leadership and for all that you've done here. For this town, I believe you have done a lot. All the best to you!

Supervisor Corl – Thank you so much, I appreciate it Tim.

Councilor Zambrano – I don't have much more to add. I believe that Jim has brought us a very long way and brought a lot of organization and structure to the Town; how the Town operates, our decision making, our budgeting, our finances. It's all been things very much for the good of the town. Certainly, we are moving in the right direction. He has provided the base by which to move forward. I think that he is leaving the town in excellent, excellent shape. I have my deepest respect and appreciation for Jim. These last two years and working with him, and it's been my privilege to work with him. Jim has been on this Town Board for 10 years and that's been a long time. There was a time when I always didn't agree with Jim, as we do know. We've had our differences in private as well, but we've come to a resolution. He has always been a gentleman. He has always been a good listener. He treats people with the utmost respect and I think the professionalism of his leadership during his tenure is to be truly, truly commended. I know that he will remain an advisor to me and to the other Town Board members. As Tim and Vern have said, we certainly look forward to working with him. I certainly look forward to his availability to me as an advisor and councilor. He has particularly good judgment; he certainly doesn't rush to any decisions. He is very thoughtful. But, Vern and Tim and I certainly will

appreciate any council you deem worthy to give us in the future, along with Mark and Mike who will join us up here in 2014. So with that, we would like to make a little presentation for you so you need to come down. So Tracy Cosilmon, as usual, with her grace and her talent and her emotion and passion, put together this very, very beautiful plaque that we are going to hang here at the Town Hall, to honor your 10 years of service.

Supervisor Corl – Oh my goodness.

Councilor Zambrano – The champagne and the cake will come later.

The audience applauded.

Supervisor Corl's mom and dad went up and stood next to him on the dais where pictures were taken.

Supervisor Corl – Wow! That was fantastic! Thank you Tracy and everybody for putting that together. We have heard a lot of positive comments about me. I'm happy to hear that. Thank you everybody. But, all of the stuff that we've been working on over the last two years, obviously it is team work. It comes down to department heads. It comes down to the Town Board. It comes down to the Town Clerk and all the elected officials, really to work together to make a difference and to accomplish I think all the things "we" not "I" have done over the last year and a half which you heard everybody speak about. I think we've really focused on how we can make the Town better. How can we make the Town Hall better? How can we make moral better. The lives of our employees better. How we can be fair and treat everybody equally – those are the things that we've been focusing on; long term planning with our budget, whether it's a road program or a vehicle replacement plan. Things that make things more efficient and it's all for the benefit of the taxpayers, the people that live within the town. We all live here in the town and we want it to be the best that it can be. I think we're really headed in the right direction and that's going to continue with Jessica's leadership – no doubt in my mind and she's going to have a great board to support her and expertise and Vern's experience on the board, and now Tim's experience. Mark and Mike, no doubt they have a lot of great ideas to work on and to implement. So we are headed in the right direction. 2014 is going to be a fantastic year for the Town of Cicero. I look forward to my role as County Legislator. Everybody still will have my cell phone and they know where to find me.

Councilor Zambrano – Don't change your number.

Supervisor Corl – I won't. So I look forward to that and a couple of people besides board members, I want to thank our engineering – Bruce, Doug and Ron DeTota. Robert Germain has done a fantastic job for us on good advice to keep us headed in the right direction and sound legal footing. On the weekends it is great to see them, play with them. And as James said they are very understanding and they are fantastic. Of course Mom and Dad who are here also, all their love and support I wouldn't be able to do it all without you two either and I appreciate everything from everybody so thank you.
